PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Term 3 started well, and it was great to see students and staff quickly settle back into work after the break.

Our students have been busy with sporting carnivals already this term. In Week 1, our eager, soccer-loving primary students attended a 6-a-side carnival in Tumby Bay, and today they're heading back to Tumby Bay for the Year 5/6 netball and football carnivals. Last week our Year 7-9 students attended AFL 9's in Port Lincoln and showcased their skills and sportsmanship, and this week we host the Year 7 European Handball competition here at Cummins. These carnivals offer a great range of opportunities for our students, tying in with both curriculum and interests, and we're grateful to our PE staff for all the planning and preparation that goes into making sure our students can take part.

After its magnificent reintroduction last year, the JP Team and organiser Tara Puckridge have made further adjustments to ensure not only the smooth running of the day, but also the best opportunities for participation and enjoyment for our children. Our Year 12 students have done a fantastic job organising their annual fundraiser, with an Australia Day theme this year. With a traditional Aussie BBQ on the menu, plus events like lamington-eating competitions and guess-the-teacher's-baby-photo, the day promises to be great fun while raising money for Sanctuary on Eyre.

One of the real strengths of our community is the way people support one another and work as a team. As a school, we see this in so many ways — our volunteers who come in to listen to reading, the family members who help out at Sports Days and Swimming Carnivals, assistance with camps and canteen volunteering, Lincoln Rural displaying our students' artwork, and the local agronomists and farmers who host machinery and farm visits for our Agriculture classes. I'd also like to acknowledge Trent Modra, who has generously donated road base to help us maintain the Bus Area where buses are parked during the day and overnight — a real help given the potholes that form there each year and the ongoing frustration they cause our bus drivers and groundsman. Thanks to everyone who works with us to broaden the experiences available to our students.

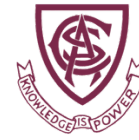

Mental Health Literacy: A Guided Reflection

Mental health is an essential part of a young person's overall wellbeing, influencing how they think, feel, learn and interact with others. Yet many of us can feel uncertain about how best to identify concerns, start conversations or access appropriate support.

Mental health literacy is not about becoming an expert. It's about recognising when something isn't right, knowing how to respond and understanding where to seek help when needed. By building this awareness and capability, we can play an important role in supporting wellbeing, reducing stigma and encouraging early help-seeking.

This Special Report explores how we can strengthen our mental health literacy and includes a Mental Health Literacy Reflection Tool. By completing a series of questions, you can reflect on your own understanding, confidence and readiness to support the mental health and wellbeing of young people.

It is an opportunity to identify your strengths, recognise areas where you may wish to build your knowledge and take positive steps towards feeling more confident in supporting children and young people.

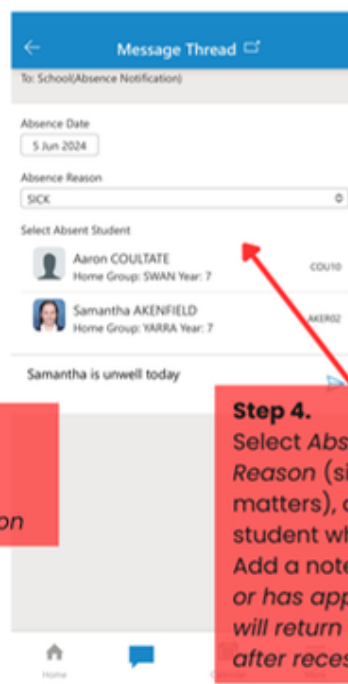
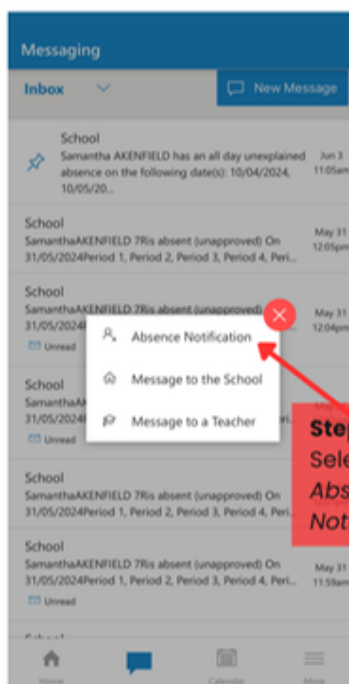
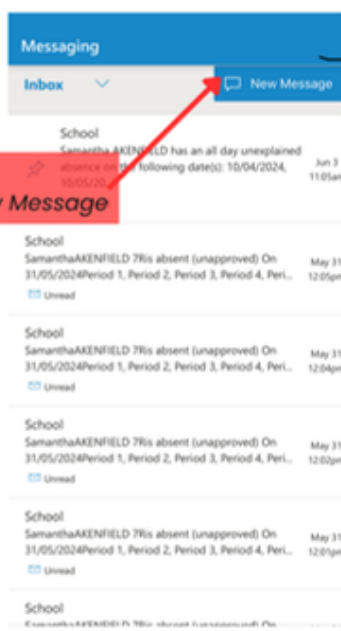

Student Lunch Passes

Students leaving the school grounds during the lunch break must carry a LUNCH PASS. There are two types of passes.

1. REGULAR LUNCH PASS: These will be issued at the beginning of each year on the written request of parents.

These passes are for students returning to their own home for lunch regularly. This pass is not to be used to access local shops to purchase lunch.

They may be issued to cover one or more days each week.

2. SPECIAL LUNCH PASS: Students are sometimes required to leave school for particular reasons on isolated occasions e.g. hair cuts, personal shopping, lunch at a friends, or a birthday party.

For each occasion, the student requires **a written request from parents through Daymap**. Students will not be permitted to phone home during the day to access a lunch pass.

Students in Year 6 or younger must be accompanied by an adult when they leave the school grounds and have the written consent of their parents if the adult signing them out is not their parent.

Students in Year 7/8/ 9 must have written parental consent and be accompanied by another student the same age or older.

Students in Year 10 - 12 are able to leave the school grounds by themselves provided they have written parental consent. Our preference would be that they don't leave the school grounds alone.

All students who leave the school at Lunch time must sign out at the computer located at the Front Office. They must sign in on their return. This is an WHS requirement and applies to students with both Permanent and Daily Lunch passes.

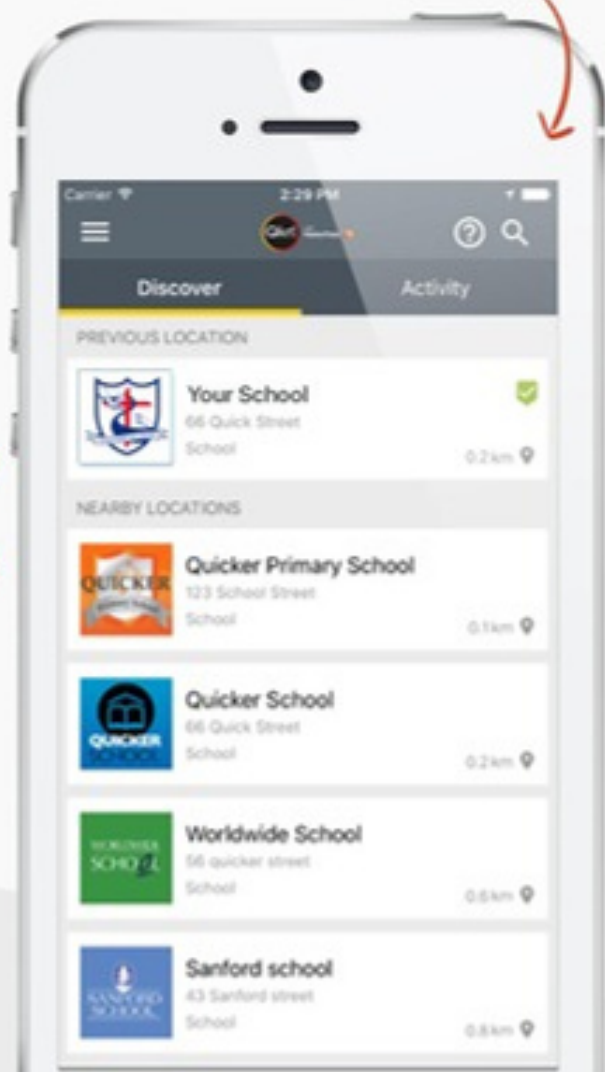

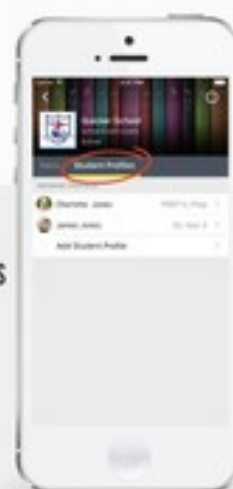

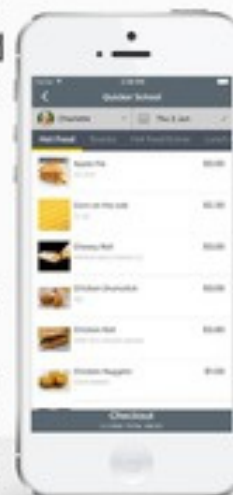
