Girls Football

11 Cummins girls made up our 9-a-side football team and the competition included 9 teams from seven school. The girls played some very good football with improvement in tackling and kicking accuracy as the day went on. Cummins won all their four pool matches and then the grand final match.

- Defeated St Josephs 14-4 to 0 (goals to Elkie, Kenzie & Miley)
- Defeated Wangary 19-10 to 0 (goals to Layla, Kenzie, Stevie, Lucy & Taya)
- Defeated Port Lincoln 110-4 to 0-2 (goals to Layla, Poppy, Ava, Lucy & Miley)
- A very close match against Tumby Bay 1 ended in a draw.

The Final match was played between the two winning pool teams and the Cummins girls played against Tumby Bay 2. Cummins won 9-13 to 2-1 (goals to Kenzie, Poppy, Ava & Lucy.)

Lochie Hazelgrove and Bryn Pugsley confidently coached and umpired for the girl's matches. Ruby Pugsley enthusiastically waved the flags while goal umpiring the matches.



Boys Netball

13 netball teams from eight schools competed in the Boys Netball competition. Cummins entered two netball teams with 17 boys involved.

Cummins Purple played five matches and won four and lost one. They had some very close matches with there only being one goal difference in three of those matches.

Dustin Siviour has just returned from representing South Australia at the School Sport Australia 10-19 years Swimming Championships at the Gold Coast. This is the second year Dustin has been selected in the team and competed in the boys 12 year age group. Dustin had a busy schedule, competing in four individual events and two relays. He made the final of the 100 metres breaststroke and did personal bests in all his individual swims. (obviously spurred on by the success of the Australian swimmers at the Olympics!!)

Results

- 100 metres breaststroke final = 8th in 1:26:18 minutes and a PB by a massive 5.33 seconds
- 200 metres individual medley in 2:57:56 minutes (PB by 1.39 secs)
- 50 metres breaststroke in 39:38 seconds (PB by 0.45 secs)
- 50 metres freestyle in 31:51 seconds (PB by 0.96 secs)
- 200 metres medley relay – breaststroke leg
- 4 X 50 metres freestyle relay

Dustin was thrilled with his results at the championships and heads to the National Country Swimming Championships in September in Darwin. Well done Dustin!

I like to think about nonsense, from pandas to purple pens, my mind traveling the length of the world in a split second, my existence imagining things I could never comprehend as I gaze into the depths of my own soul, my awareness focused solely on myself as I try to unravel the universe's secrets on the information my subconscious provides from an unknowable source, as I sit and wish to be taken away on an adventure by an intangible being.

Sometimes, I like to reflect on the things that don't make sense, because I believe that every now and then, people could use some nonsense.

HEADLICE

We have had confirmation of some cases of Head Lice and Nits in classes.

RESPONSIBILITY

Parents and guardians are responsible for checking and treating children for head lice. Pre-schools, schools and child care centres are not.

School and child care centre staff are responsible for informing parents and guardians of cases or suspected cases of head lice.

PREVENTING THE SPREAD

- > check for head lice weekly – daily during head lice outbreaks
- > treat head lice as soon as they are detected
- > avoid direct head-to-head contact
- > keep long hair firmly plaited or braided and slick down stray hairs with hairspray or gel
- > avoid sharing brushes, combs, hats and helmets

CHECKING FOR HEAD LICE & NITS

Check everyone in the household for head lice weekly, or daily during an outbreak.

The wet combing technique is a reliable method of checking for head lice, as the conditioner makes lice easier to detect.

If head lice are detected, start treatment using the preferred method. If only nits are found, chemical treatment is not required but wet combing may be done.

Student Lunch Passes

Students leaving the school grounds during the lunch break must carry a LUNCH PASS. There are two types of passes.

1. REGULAR LUNCH PASS: These will be issued at the beginning of each year on the written request of parents.

These passes are for students returning to their own home for lunch regularly. This pass is not to be used to access local shops to purchase lunch.

They may be issued to cover one or more days each week.

2. SPECIAL LUNCH PASS: Students are sometimes required to leave school for particular reasons on isolated occasions e.g. hair cuts, personal shopping, lunch at a friends, or a birthday party.

For each occasion, the student requires **a written request from parents through Daymap**. Students will not be permitted to phone home during the day to access a lunch pass.

Students in Year 6 or younger must be accompanied by an adult when they leave the school grounds and have the written consent of their parents if the adult signing them out is not their parent.

Students in Year 7/8/ 9 must have written parental consent and be accompanied by another student the same age or older.

Students in Year 10 – 12 are able to leave the school grounds by themselves provided they have written parental consent. Our preference would be that they don't leave the school grounds alone.

All students who leave the school at Lunch time must sign out at the computer located at the Front Office. They must sign in on their return. This is an WHS requirement and applies to students with both Permanent and Daily Lunch passes.

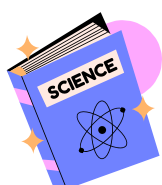

Due to the introduction of Standard 3.3.2a – Food and Safety Management Tools our school Canteen is identified as a Category 1. This requires us to have all our valued Canteen Volunteers to complete the free online food and safety training – **Do Food Safely**.

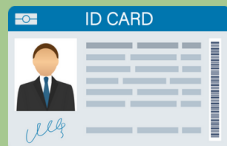
Do Food Safely provides the required course content, and once completed food handlers will receive a certificate which will be required to be sighted by authorised officers and we can keep a record of your certificate also at the canteen. The course is approx. 40 minutes with 2 parts – 7 Topic/Information slides with quick questions and then a 30-question assessment at the end. The course is valid for 5 years and can be used for all sporting and community groups handling food which will also be required.

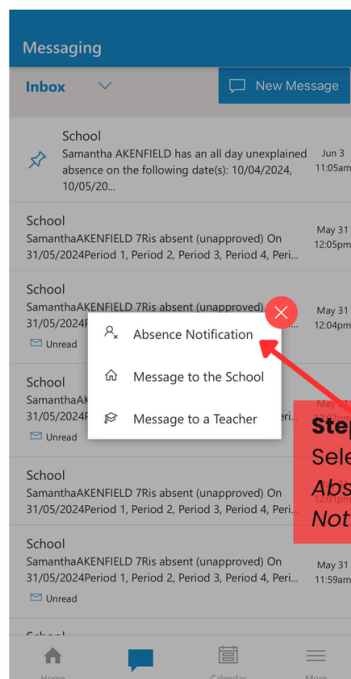
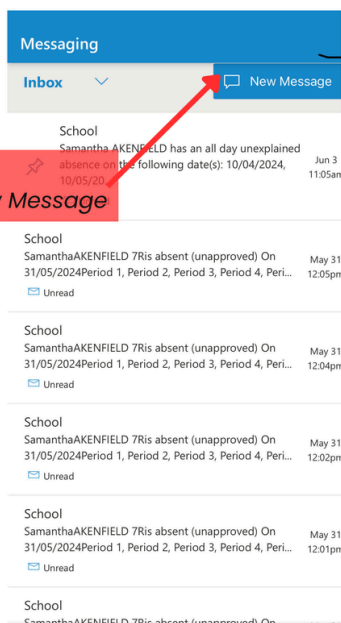

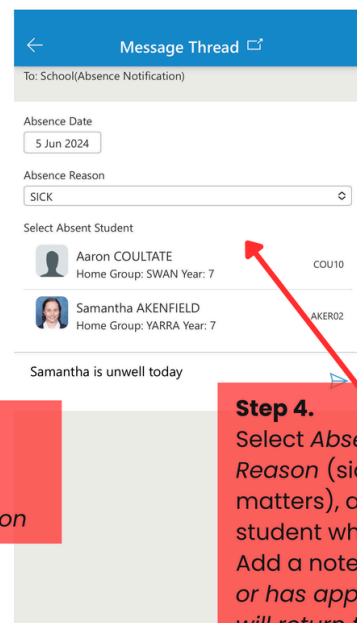
Notifying CAS of a student absence using the DayMap App

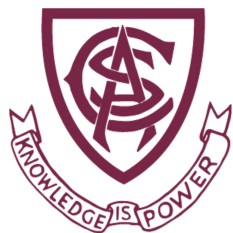
