PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Hi Everyone

Thanks to everyone who attended our Open Night last night to meet teachers, immerse yourself in your child/ren's learning spaces and learn a bit about SACE, Daymap and our Behaviour Support Policy. It is vital that we work together to provide sound educational outcomes for your children and afternoons / evenings like this allow an informal



opportunity to share our beliefs and gather input from important stakeholders such as families and students. We hope to provide further opportunities for engagement at school throughout the year and would be keen to hear of any other sessions that you feel would be pertinent.

The current focus across the site is all about being "Ready to Learn". Before any teaching / learning begins in a lesson it is vital that certain conditions are in place for learners to be ready. These basic routines establish a sense of consistency around expectations around how we operate in the classroom and assist our more anxious learners with knowing what will come next. Classes will be explicitly focusing on these routines for the rest of the term.

If you live in Cummins you may be aware that our siren has been a little erratic over the past two days. We are in the midst of reprogramming the archaic technology to add in 5 min warning bells to indicate that Recess and Lunch are nearly over. The reasoning behind this is to assist our students to prepare to reenter classes for learning. For some students this helps them transition from play to "work", for others it is a timely reminder to fill up water bottles, go to the toilet etc. so that they are ready to be present in class once the lesson commences.

Swimming Carnival was a raging success. We had a fabulous turnout of parents and families and high participation rates from the children who attended. Highlights were the breaking of 3 records, a lot of determined participants and a clean win to the Staff relay team. I will concede that it is possibly the first time we have won the event fair and square... Congratulations to Flinders on what was ultimately a very tight win over Eyre. I would also like to acknowledge the work done by our House Captains in organising relay teams and encouraging team spirit. We now look forward to Sports Day being just as successful albeit a little bit cooler, I hope!

Staff have been busy attending a number of Professional Development events over the past few weeks. These opportunities are important elements in our efforts to improve learning outcomes for all of our students. In the past few weeks we have had staff attending Early Career Teacher training, Positive Partnerships Autism Awareness training, the SACE Agriculture forum, and Key teacher training. Boyd and I also had the privilege of participating in the first two days of a four day Leadership course on Leading Future Learners, which has inspired us further to imagine the possibilities within our site. We look forward to sharing these ideas with you and gaining voice from families, staff and students about what this means for Cummins Area School.

Year 3-12 Swimming Carnival 2024

On Friday, 16th February, students from Years 3-12 assembled at the Cummins and District Memorial Swimming Pool for the annual Cummins Area School Swimming Carnival. Staff, parents, friends and family watched on proudly as the students competed for their respective house colours of red (Eyre), yellow (Flinders) or blue (Sturt). We were blessed with near perfect conditions for the event, meaning the stage was set for a fantastic day of racing. 25 metres freestyle, breaststroke and backstroke races were timed on the day with many close results witnessed. The 100 metres freestyle events took place prior to the carnival. Some impressive times were taken with three students breaking previously held records.

The 4 x 25 metres mixed freestyle relays concluded the formal races with students eagerly competing in their houses for the final points of the carnival. This was just prior to the customary staff V parents V house captains V ex-students relay, which turned out to be an entertaining end to the carnival.

The Yvonne Majoor Shield was presented by Yvonne's proud son, Boyd West. Yvonne attended Cummins Area School and was part of the 1974 Australian Commonwealth Games Swimming Team that went to Christchurch, New Zealand. In the end, it was Flinders who reclaimed their title as the school's best in the pool with a marginal victory over Eyre. Final results were Flinders 1324, Eyre 1302 and Sturt 1091. Flinders house captains, Noah and Bella Giddings, and Poppy Blacker and Tom Shirley proudly accepted the shield on behalf of their ecstatic team members.

Cummins Area School Canteen Compulsory Food & Safety Training

Due to the introduction of Standard 3.3.2a – Food and Safety Management Tools our school Canteen is identified as a Category I. This requires us to have all our valued Canteen Volunteers to complete the free online food and safety training – **Do Food Safely.**

The online course can be found at the following link or by scanning the QR code.

Do Food Safely provides the required course content, and once completed food handlers will receive a certificate which will be required to be sighted by authorised officers and we can keep a record of your certificate also at the canteen. The course is approx. 40 minutes with 2 parts - 7 Topic/Information slides with quick questions and then a 30-question assessment at the end. The course is valid for 5 years and can be used for all sporting and community groups handling food which will also be required.

Student Lunch Passes

Students leaving the school grounds during the lunch break must carry a LUNCH PASS. There are two types of passes.

1. REGULAR LUNCH PASS: These will be issued at the beginning of each year on the written request of parents.

These passes are for students returning to their own home for lunch regularly. This pass is not to be used to access local shops to purchase lunch.

They may be issued to cover one or more days each week.

2. SPECIAL LUNCH PASS: Students are sometimes required to leave school for particular reasons on isolated occasions e.g. hair cuts, personal shopping, lunch at a friends, or a birthday party.

For each occasion, the student requires **a written request from parents through Daymap**. Students will not be permitted to phone home during the day to access a lunch pass.

Students in Year 6 or younger must be accompanied by an adult when they leave the school grounds and have the written consent of their parents if the adult signing them out is not their parent.

Students in Year 7/8/ 9 must have written parental consent and be accompanied by another student the same age or older.

Students in Year 10 – 12 are able to leave the school grounds by themselves provided they have written parental consent. Our preference would be that they don't leave the school grounds alone.

All students who leave the school at Lunch time must sign out at the computer located at the Front Office. They must sign in on their return. This is an WHS requirement and applies to students with both Permanent and Daily Lunch passes.



BYOD LAPTOP PROGRAM FOR YR 7–12 STUDENTS

All students from Year 7 to Year 12 are required to supply their own laptop for use at school.

We ask that ALL purchases of new laptops for school use, for all year levels, be made via the School Ordering Portal. This alleviates the current issue of the many varied devices being purchased which do not meet the required minimum specifications for use at school.

The online Order Portal provides families with a variety of suitable devices which meet the required specifications, including some accessories, insurance and finance options. The devices found on the portal have been chosen for their battery performance, durability of cases, network compatibility and based on recommendations from industry experts.

Other considerations when purchasing a device for your student:

- Insurance: check your home contents insurance to see if the device will be covered
- Transport between home and school: device should be carried in a sturdy protective bag away from food & water bottles
- **Charging:** Students must charge their device at home and bring it to school every day fully charged. (Personal power adapters are not to be used at school unless Tag Tested).
- Students have access to **Microsoft Office 365** via their School email account at no cost, providing access to Word, Excel, Powerpoint, One Drive etc. There is no need to purchase this software separately.
- Whilst enrolled at school, students are connected to the school provided internet and are protected by a significant Departmental filtering system that prevents access to many harmful or malicious sites. According to Cummins Area School ICT Acceptable Use Policy, students may use the internet only for learning related activities that are approved by a teacher.
- It is the responsibility of the student / parent / caregiver to setup the Home-Internet connection on the device.
- Students must perform 'Software Updates' on the device as they become available in order to install the latest virus definitions and security patches.
- Students will use OneDrive provided through Office 365 which safeguards work from being lost on a USB etc. Students are also strongly encouraged to backup necessary files in numerous locations, including via email where appropriate. Technology failure is not an approved circumstance for extensions at Cummins Area School.

*Device chosen must take into consideration the types of subjects the student is studying eg; Design related subjects may require an i7 (Senior High School students)

**Please note; Apple devices are not recommended for use in our school environment as they are not compatible with our school network and will impact your child's ability to access school services such as printing. Apple devices will not be supported by the School IT Department.
