Our students lit up the stage during week 4 this term for our Cummins Area School production of DreamWorks Shrek the Musical. It was a truly magical adventure for those who came along and saw our talented and courageous cast on stage singing, dancing and acting! Our swamp aka the school hall, was buzzing with laughter, gasps, tears and immense pride. Our band of student musicians had the opportunity to perform live (and by goodness, did they perform), with audiences clapping and singing along! And a show like this can't go on without its crucial team of backstage crew - directors, producers, stagehands, sound, lighting makeup, facepainting, hair, costumes, seamstresses, catering, publicity, ticketing, marketing and design, sets, props, decorators, choreographers, videographers, photography, vocal coaches, music leaders, ushers, maintenance and admin, support people - the list goes on and on like Pinocchio's nose.

Their impromptu performance really highlighting their incredible improvisation talents! Twelve of our cast then headed to Miroma Place Hostel, putting on a delightful array of songs for the residents. It was wonderful to be able to provide that sort of energy and entertainment for the elderly members of our community, with many connecting through music and song. On Thursday 14 August it was our Matinee - the first performance for the general public plus visiting students from Tumby Bay Area School, Elliston Area School and St Joseph's School. Next it was our sell-out show on Friday 15th and wow what a performance, followed by another showstopper on Saturday 16 August. The night shows were electric, and every member of the cast, crew, band and audience were glowing with achievement.

The shows were wonderfully complemented by the CAS Canteen who transformed our plaza into a swamp, working through the rain and serving everything from Ogre nugs to Shrexican swamp bowls and Gingy biscuits. We were so very grateful to them for feeding us, our audiences and for their outstanding time and effort.


Additionally, how students approach their study sessions is equally important. Taking regular breaks is a crucial part of this process in maintaining focus and preventing burnout.

Student Lunch Passes

Students leaving the school grounds during the lunch break must carry a LUNCH PASS. There are two types of passes.

1. REGULAR LUNCH PASS: These will be issued at the beginning of each year on the written request of parents.

These passes are for students returning to their own home for lunch regularly. This pass is not to be used to access local shops to purchase lunch.

They may be issued to cover one or more days each week.

2. SPECIAL LUNCH PASS: Students are sometimes required to leave school for particular reasons on isolated occasions e.g. hair cuts, personal shopping, lunch at a friends, or a birthday party.

For each occasion, the student requires **a written request from parents through Daymap**. Students will not be permitted to phone home during the day to access a lunch pass.

Students in Year 6 or younger must be accompanied by an adult when they leave the school grounds and have the written consent of their parents if the adult signing them out is not their parent.

Students in Year 7/8/ 9 must have written parental consent and be accompanied by another student the same age or older.

Students in Year 10 - 12 are able to leave the school grounds by themselves provided they have written parental consent. Our preference would be that they don't leave the school grounds alone.

All students who leave the school at Lunch time must sign out at the computer located at the Front Office. They must sign in on their return. This is an WHS requirement and applies to students with both Permanent and Daily Lunch passes.

BYOD LAPTOP PROGRAMFOR YR 7-12 STUDENTS

All students from Year 7 to Year 12 are required to supply their own laptop for use at school.

We ask that ALL purchases of new laptops for school use, for all year levels, be made via the School Ordering Portal. This alleviates the current issue of the many varied devices being purchased which do not meet the required minimum specifications for use at school.

The online Order Portal provides families with a variety of suitable devices which meet the required specifications, including some accessories, insurance and finance options. The devices found on the portal have been chosen for their battery performance, durability of cases, network compatibility and based on recommendations from industry experts.

Other considerations when purchasing a device for your student:

- Insurance: check your home contents insurance to see if the device will be covered
- Transport between home and school: device should be carried in a sturdy protective bag away from food & water bottles
- **Charging:** Students must charge their device at home and bring it to school every day fully charged. (Personal power adapters are not to be used at school unless Tag Tested).
- Students have access to **Microsoft Office 365** via their School email account at no cost, providing access to Word, Excel, Powerpoint, One Drive etc. There is no need to purchase this software separately.
- Whilst enrolled at school, students are connected to the school provided internet and are protected by a significant Departmental filtering system that prevents access to many harmful or malicious sites. According to Cummins Area School ICT Acceptable Use Policy, students may use the internet only for learning related activities that are approved by a teacher.
- It is the responsibility of the student / parent / caregiver to setup the Home-Internet connection on the device.
- Students must perform 'Software Updates' on the device as they become available in order to install the latest virus definitions and security patches.
- Students will use OneDrive provided through Office 365 which safeguards work from being lost on a USB etc. Students
 are also strongly encouraged to backup necessary files in numerous locations, including via email where appropriate.
 Technology failure is not an approved circumstance for extensions at Cummins Area School.

*Device chosen must take into consideration the types of subjects the student is studying eg; Design related subjects may require an i7 (Senior High School students)

**Please note; Apple devices are not recommended for use in our school environment as they are not compatible with our school network and will impact your child's ability to access school services such as printing. Apple devices will not be supported by the School IT Department.

JOB VACANCY

Casual Bus Driver Cummins Area School

> Responsibilities:

- Safely drive the school bus using judgement and care in response to the road, weather and driving conditions.
- Ensure the safety of students and other approved passengers, whilst they enter, exit and travel on the school bus, which includes assisting students and other approved passengers with disabilities (where applicable) to get on and off the bus, as well as monitoring the general behaviour of students.
- Follow an approved route to pick up and transport school children and approved passengers.'
- Obey the Speed limit and all road laws, rules, and regulations at all times.
- Conduct a full bus inspection at the end of each trip/journey to ensure No student remains on the bus.
- Complete a pre-journey checklist before and after each journey
- Maintain a clean and sanitary bus (Inside and out) at all times.
- Deliver the school bus to the servicing garage to undertake maintenance inspections.
- Contribute to maintaining a healthy work environment by taking personal accountability by identifying and reports incidents, hazards and injuries in accordant with Department for Education policies and procedures.
