PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Welcome to Term Three

Today marks the beginning of the formal education of our 8 new Reception students, who will be joining Miss Bennie and her class. We take this opportunity to welcome not only new families to Cummins Area School, but also the children joining their siblings as students at CAS. I'm sure there were many big feelings as these students arrived at school today, ready to take on the next stage of their journey.

Yesterday, staff used the Student Free Day to focus on key elements of our Site Learning Plan. Teachers and SSO staff spent time reviewing our Positive Behaviours for Learning progress and identifying next steps. Our Inclusion Coordinator, Helen Higgins, led us through some foundational work on Inclusion in its broadest sense and gave us a preview of the more specific work we'll undertake as a site on our next Student Free Day in August. We also spent time on the Dispositions element of the SA Curriculum, which will be mandated across all SA public schools from the start of next year. This curriculum builds on the Australian Curriculum by foregrounding the dispositions and capabilities that sit alongside the content knowledge – aligning closely with the purpose our Cummins Area School community developed in 2024 through consultation with staff, students and families. Attached to this newsletter is a summary of our Site Learning Plan and purpose, as a reminder of the vision we created together.

Last term ended with a flurry of activity, especially for our Year 10 students, who took full advantage of the opportunities offered on our annual Careers Trip. This term, our Year 10 students begin the Youth Opportunities Journey with Lucy Pedler and Paul Stoddard. We're grateful to the Cummins and District Branch of the Bendigo Bank for their ongoing commitment to sponsoring this successful program. Our Year 7–9 students continue to work with Tom Jonas and Nat von Bertouch as part of the Bloom Academy Leadership program. Between these two programs, we look forward to continuing to develop confident, capable and reflective future leaders of our community.

As noted last term, we have some staffing changes this term. Rachel Dunstan will be taking over Miss Indiah's F/1 class while she settles into her new role as mum to Stevie Hazel. Paddy Rowe and Jed Woolford are taking Paternity Leave for the remainder of the year and will be replaced by Todd Coleman and Julie Gerber. We also welcome Ally Mooney to our SSO team.

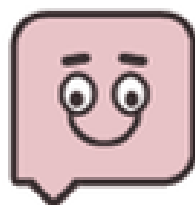

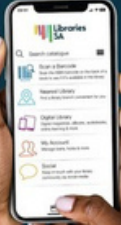

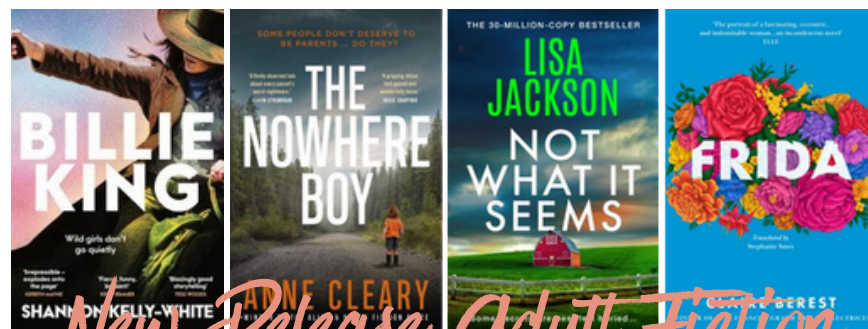

Remember: no payment means no order.



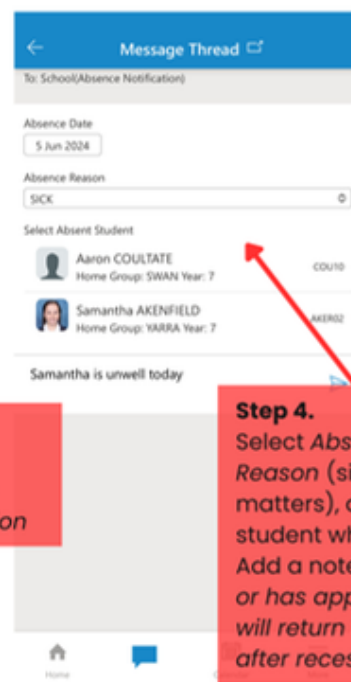
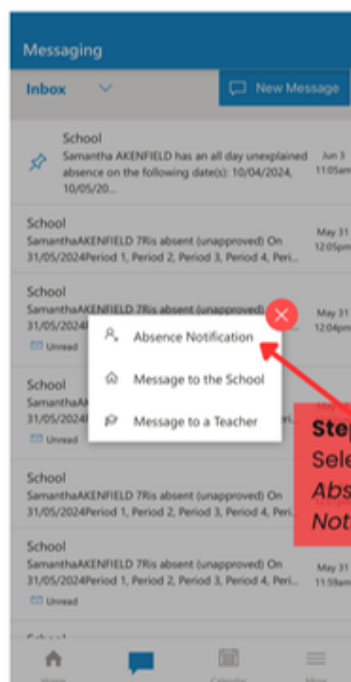
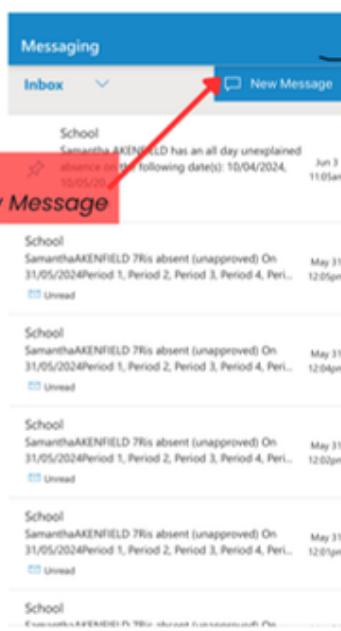

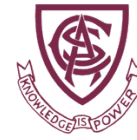


Digital Reputation

Student Lunch Passes

Students leaving the school grounds during the lunch break must carry a LUNCH PASS. There are two types of passes.

1. REGULAR LUNCH PASS: These will be issued at the beginning of each year on the written request of parents.

These passes are for students returning to their own home for lunch regularly. This pass is not to be used to access local shops to purchase lunch.

They may be issued to cover one or more days each week.

2. SPECIAL LUNCH PASS: Students are sometimes required to leave school for particular reasons on isolated occasions e.g. hair cuts, personal shopping, lunch at a friends, or a birthday party.

For each occasion, the student requires **a written request from parents through Daymap**. Students will not be permitted to phone home during the day to access a lunch pass.

Students in Year 6 or younger must be accompanied by an adult when they leave the school grounds and have the written consent of their parents if the adult signing them out is not their parent.

Students in Year 7/8/ 9 must have written parental consent and be accompanied by another student the same age or older.

Students in Year 10 - 12 are able to leave the school grounds by themselves provided they have written parental consent. Our preference would be that they don't leave the school grounds alone.

All students who leave the school at Lunch time must sign out at the computer located at the Front Office. They must sign in on their return. This is an WHS requirement and applies to students with both Permanent and Daily Lunch passes.
